EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING - INTERACTIVE SCHOOL TOURS 2024

Follow the footsteps of refugees and people seeking asylum in this simulated experience. Through the tour students will experience the journey of a refugee and gain a better understanding of their challenges as they search for safety and settle in Australia.

- Tours are delivered by guides with 'lived experience' from a range of refugee and asylum seeker backgrounds.
- Interactive activities provide an opportunity for students to engage with refugee issues.
- The journey is linked to real urban or refugee camp experiences of shelter, food, education, and choices for resettlement.
- Active participation and involvement of students throughout the interactive tour.
- Debrief session after the tour for students to reflect on the experience.
- Links to a range of Australian curriculum HSIE, Geography, History, PDHPE, English, Legal Studies, Economics, Project Based Learning, Social Justice, Religious Studies, as well as cross curriculum priorities: Australia's engagement in Asia and Sustainability./

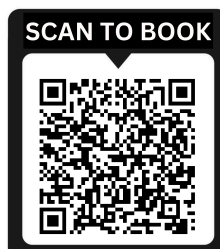
